# FY 2024-2025 Highlights



#### mStreet Fiber Memphis - PILOT (February 2024)

With a 15 year jobs PILOT, mStreet Fiber Memphis will install 3,400 miles of high-speed fiber optic cable, investing \$829 million and creating 15 new jobs with an average wage of \$123,533.

#### Reconext Tennessee, LLC – Fast Track PILOT (July 2024)

Reconext was awarded a 10-year Fast Track PILOT to locate operations in Memphis, creating 161 new jobs with an average annual salary of \$39,000.

#### 100 North Main, LLC - EDGE Commercial Loan Amendment (July 2024)

EDGE approved a total of \$6.8 million in loan funding for the \$261 million revamp of the 37-story 100 North Main building into a mixed-use destination.

#### 85 Danny Thomas - Loan Agreement (August 2024)

Investors were approved for a \$750,000 loan for the \$4.8 million redevelopment of the former BlueCross BlueShield building at 85 N. Danny Thomas Blvd.

#### Cardinal Energy Storage East – Property Lease Agreement (October 2024)

EDGE approved a 20-year lease for Cardinal Energy to develop a large-scale energy storage facility with options for additional extensions, enhancing Memphis's energy resilience.

#### CTC Property – Property Lease Agreement (October 2024)

CTC secured a long-term lease-purchase agreement for 552 acres to develop a major industrial hub, supporting regional economic expansion.

# FY 2024-2025 Highlights



#### AAON, Inc. - PILOT (November 2024)

AAON Inc. is expanding to Memphis with a 15-year PILOT, creating 828 jobs with an average wage of \$57,000, and a Community Reinvestment Act credit of \$38.6 million.

#### Riko's Kickin Chicken - Small Business Loan (November 2024)

Backed by a \$22,500 Small Business Loan, Riko's Kickin Chicken is upgrading its location to expand the menu, create new jobs, and continue serving the community that made it a Memphis favorite.

#### Hard Times Delicatessen LLC - Small Business Loan (December 2024)

Hard Times Deli transformed an abandoned building into a successful, vibrant sandwich shop, thanks to a \$25,000 Small Business Loan from EDGE.

#### LifeScience Logistics, LLC – Fast Track PILOT (April 2025)

LifeScience Logistics received a 10-year Fast Track PILOT to expand operations in Memphis, creating 101 new jobs with an average wage of \$61,850.

A total of **12 amendments** were processed during fiscal years 2024 and 2025. These modifications reflect the adaptive nature of EDGE's long-term partnerships and the evolving needs of businesses. The amended projects include:

Aesthetic Management: Amendment Medtronic: Assignment of full PILOT to Medtronic

These amendments often involve adjustments to timelines, capital investment levels, or job commitments, and they underscore the importance of maintaining long-term alignment with business needs.

# The Port of Memphis

#### **Driving Global Commerce and Regional Logistics**

As the second-largest inland port on the shallow draft portion of the Mississippi River and the sixth-largest in the U.S., the Port of Memphis is a powerful driver of global commerce and regional logistics. EDGE's stewardship of this asset ensures continued investment in infrastructure, transportation, and job-generating industry on the riverfront.







# The Port of Memphis

#### **Driving Global Commerce and Regional Logistics**

#### Key Projects: FY 2024-2025



The Port Commission acquired the 46-acre former Navy property on Presidents Island and demolished the remaining 19,000-square-foot building through a TVA grant. Now part of the State of Tennessee's "Select Site" program, it is the only large industrial site in Shelby County with that designation.

The Presidents Island 1,000-acre industrial park is nearing full capacity, with less than five sites available and none larger than three acres. Longstanding tenants continue to invest by purchasing additional properties on the island. The vacancy rate is at an all-time low, signaling strong demand and growth.

#### **Driving Global Commerce and Regional Logistics**



A \$6 million roadway improvement project was recently completed on Presidents Island, repaving the primary entry and one arterial road. Funded through the Memphis Transportation Improvement Program, the project was supported by the City of Memphis and the State of Tennessee.

The Port leased more than 500 acres in the Pidgeon Industrial Area to CTC, an xAI affiliate. The site will support energy infrastructure related to the nearby xAI supercomputer facility, including solar and energy storage applications.







### **Driving Global Commerce and Regional Logistics**



A new lease was signed with Cardinal Energy Storage for a 20 to 30-acre site in Pidgeon Industrial Park, adjacent to the xAI development. The facility will house a battery bank connected to TVA's 500kV line, supplying power to the grid during peak demand periods.

The Port and Nucor Steel secured dredging authorization for the Pidgeon Industrial Harbor through the 2024 Water Resources Development Act. This inclusion allows eligibility for federal dredging funds. The Port is currently working with the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers to complete the Assumption of Maintenance Report needed to move forward.



Strategic real estate projects are revitalizing commercial corridors, repurposing vacant buildings, and unlocking economic potential in key neighborhoods. Through public-private partnerships and targeted incentives, EDGE is shaping spaces where people want to live, work, and invest.

Key Projects: FY 2024-2025

#### One Memphis Place - C-PACER Loan

One Memphis Place, a 15-story office tower in Downtown Memphis, is undergoing a \$1.7 million environmentally focused renovation thanks to a C-PACER loan approved by EDGE. The improvements, ranging from renewable energy systems to water and energy conservation upgrades, are expected to save \$42,000 in annual utility costs and reduce water usage by 348,000 gallons annually. This effort, part of a larger \$17.6 million financing package, reflects a broader push for sustainable, resilient commercial real estate. With this project, One Memphis Place sets a new benchmark for green development while creating economic opportunities for local small businesses.



#### 100 North Main, LLC - Commercial Loan Amendment

Memphis' tallest building, 100 North Main, is being transformed into a \$261 million mixed-use landmark. In 2023, EDGE approved a \$5 million loan to kickstart redevelopment, followed by an additional \$1.8 million in 2024 to address predemolition and equipment needs. Plans include hotel rooms, apartments, office space, and the return of the iconic rooftop restaurant. This project is reshaping the skyline while signaling Downtown Memphis' resurgence and long-term economic potential.











#### 85 Danny Thomas – Loan Agreement

In April 2024, Memphis entrepreneurs launched a \$4.8 million effort to renovate the former Blue Cross Blue Shield HQ at 85 N. Danny Thomas Boulevard. EDGE approved a \$750,000 loan to support the acquisition and improvements to this LEED Platinum-certified building – one of only two in Memphis. While tenants are still being finalized, the revitalization of this Downtown site underscores the power of local leadership and strategic investment in reactivating key properties.

#### Transforming Spaces, Building Futures

#### Vitality Hotel - C-PACER Loan

The former Crowne Plaza on Thousand Oaks Boulevard has reopened as Vitality Hotel, a 319-room full-service destination supported by a \$3.7 million C-PACER loan approved by EDGE. Renovated by LW Memphis IV, LLC, the hotel now features a restaurant, bar, meeting spaces, pools, and fitness amenities across 217,000 square feet. With total project costs nearing \$36.7 million, the redevelopment reactivates a high-visibility corridor in East Memphis. The C-PACER loan played a critical role in reducing energy and infrastructure costs while avoiding public subsidies – advancing both hospitality reinvestment and sustainable development.









# Workforce Development + Community Engagement

#### **Empowering Our People**

People are at the center of every project EDGE supports. From career pathways to neighborhood revitalization, our workforce and community initiatives are creating opportunities for residents across Shelby County.

#### Key Projects: FY 2024-2025

#### **Hyosung HICO Expansion**

In a major win for workforce development, Hyosung HICO announced a **\$51 million expansion** of its U.S. manufacturing headquarters in southwest Memphis. The project will create **123 new, high-quality jobs**, further anchoring the city as a hub for advanced manufacturing.

Prior to the extension, EDGE awarded the company with an 11-year PILOT for Real and Personal Property in 2019. Since establishing its operations, Hyosung has cited Memphis' skilled labor force and logistical advantages as key reasons for continued investment. The expansion is a testament to Memphis' industrial infrastructure and to the power of public-private collaboration in fueling economic opportunity. Located on a 200-acre site with rail and water access, the facility is poised to become the nation's top supplier of large power transformers by 2027.



# Workforce Development + Community Engagement

#### **Empowering Our People**

#### Incentives for AAON, Inc.

In fiscal years 2024 and 2025, EDGE approved incentives for large-scale job-creating developments, including AAON Inc.'s \$238.5 million factory expansion, creating 291 jobs, and the \$261 million 100 North Main downtown redevelopment. These public-private projects provide career opportunities and boost local supply chains.



#### **Workforce Training & Outreach**

EDGE promotes workforce development by supporting efforts to connect businesses with local training, apprenticeship, and mentorship programs. Leadership encourages companies to engage with these initiatives to strengthen Memphis's talent pipeline. EDGE participates in community events like college open houses and externships to promote careers in key industries, such as manufacturing, logistics, and IT.

**Empowering Our People** 

#### **Crime-Prevention Grants (CPTED)**

EDGE, in collaboration with the City of Memphis and Memphis Police Department, launched a four-year initiative using Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design (CPTED) to strengthen small businesses in high-crime areas. With \$1 million in total funding, this program provides \$250,000 annually in the form of reimbursement grants and loans to help small businesses invest in security enhancements and recover from criminal activity.

CPTED is internationally recognized for reducing crime through intentional design and environmental planning. In Memphis, it will support local businesses by improving visibility, access control, and overall safety. This approach creates safer neighborhoods while fostering economic growth and restoring community confidence in key corridors.



# **Small Business Loan Program**

#### Revitalizing Memphis' Neighborhoods

EDGE's Small Business Loan Program provides small, forgivable loans up to \$25,000 to revitalize Memphis business districts. Primarily used for building façade and streetscape improvements, the program is funded by special City of Memphis and Shelby County PILOT personal property fees. Since 2014, these loans have supported projects **investing nearly \$9 million in Memphis**.





#### FY 2024-2025 Impact

EDGE provided \$796,104 to 35 businesses located in distressed neighborhoods throughout Memphis. These businesses have helped to spark revitalization, investing more than \$3.2 million back into their neighborhoods, and employing more than 155 people.

Small Loans, Big Impact

#### Hard Times Delicatessen

With the help of a \$25,000 Small Business Loan from EDGE, Hard Times Delicatessen transformed a long-vacant Edge District building into a vibrant sandwich shop. Founded by chefs Harrison Downing, Cole Jeanes, and Schuyler O'Brien, the deli brings high-quality, locally sourced comfort food to the neighborhood – while also creating jobs and foot traffic near Sun Studio. Known for house-smoked meats, scratch-made sauces, and community-minded sourcing, Hard Times Deli is a symbol of sustainable, chef-driven entrepreneurship that supports Memphis farmers, producers, and the local economy.



# Small Business Loan Program: Success Stories

Small Loans, Big Impact

#### **Uncle Lou's Fried Chicken**

Uncle Lou's Fried Chicken, a Whitehaven staple featured on The Food Network, received a \$25,000 Small Business Loan from EDGE to expand and modernize its original Millbranch Road location. Founded in 2001 by Lou Martin, the beloved spot outgrew its space after two decades of local and national acclaim. The expansion preserves a cherished Memphis brand while boosting job creation and revitalizing a key neighborhood corridor. Uncle Lou's story proves how small business investment drives community pride, strengthens local economies, and honors the dreams of those who built them from the ground up.








#### Fueling Job Growth in Our City

In fiscal years 2024 and 2025, EDGE strategically approved six Payment in Lieu of Taxes (PILOTs), encompassing both Fast Track and Jobs initiatives, to stimulate growth across key sectors such as manufacturing, logistics, and distribution. These PILOT programs aim to attract investment and foster job creation within the local economy.

#### **EDGE FY 2024-2025 PILOT Agreements**

A total of **6 PILOTs** were approved during the two fiscal years: **4 Fast Track PILOTs** and **2 Job PILOTs**.





These were streamlined incentives designed for projects that met specific thresholds for capital investment and job creation. These projects supported economic development in a range of sectors including logistics, distribution, manufacturing, broadband infrastructure and residential services, reflecting the region's diversified industry mix.

# Payment in Lieu of Taxes (PILOTs)

#### **EDGE FY 2024-2025: Other Development Activities**

#### Lease Transactions: 2

EDGE executed two lease-related economic development agreements, facilitating access to key properties to support growth or expansion plans.

#### **C-PACER Loans: 2**

Commercial Property Assessed Clean Energy and Resiliency (C-PACER) financing was issued for two properties. This tool supports energy-efficient and resilient infrastructure upgrades without public grants or abatements.

#### **EDGE Loans: 2**

Two EDGE commercial loans were approved to support property redevelopment, contributing to site revitalization and improved land use.




# **Our Projects**

#### **Entrepreneurship City: Where Grit Meets Growth**

Entrepreneurship City is a campaign and movement launched in partnership with the City of Memphis. It celebrates and empowers local entrepreneurs by amplifying their stories, expanding access to resources, and uniting the city's entrepreneurial ecosystem under one banner. From small business loans to youth-centered programs, this initiative positions Memphis as a city where ideas start, scale, and succeed. #### **MEM**x

MEMx is an economic development cooperative led by Start Co. president Andre Fowlkes, designed to strategically align partners across the Memphis region to create innovation-driven growth. Through its blueprint, it works to establish sustained capital structures, policy reform, and capacity-building that elevate jobs and talent pipelines. By convening new leadership across agencies and fostering meaningful collaboration, MEMx advances a vision of sustainable growth that positions Memphis for long-term competitiveness.

MEMx is preparing Memphis to adapt to a rapidly shifting job market, where projections show 23% of local jobs could transition in the next five years. By building proactive strategies, MEMx connects local talent, technology, and resources to attract new industries, grow startups, and strengthen existing companies, driving collaboration to secure Memphis' place as a national center for innovation.

#### Mid-South Hub





The National Science Foundation's I-Corps Program helps early-stage entrepreneurs turn ideas into businesses, with Vanderbilt and nine university partners leading the way. Thanks to MEMx's recruitment, the University of Memphis became the 10th partner, supporting 33 researchers, entrepreneurs, and businesses so far.

#### Sky High

Sky High Accelerator offers immersion programs, quick tracks, and online learning for music, main street, innovation, and social entrepreneurs.

MEMx designed the program and provides curriculum and content to expand opportunities for South Memphis entrepreneurs.



#### **HR&A Advisors**



MEMx engaged HR&A Advisors with a \$210,000 investment to build a catalytic fund and shape policies that drive innovation and capital growth in Memphis. This effort aligns with city priorities like housing and major development projects while advancing MEMx's mission of regional innovation.

#### **American Dream Initiative Solutions Summit**

In 2025, AEI hosted its Solutions Summit in Memphis, convening 150 leaders on topics from AI in the workforce to affordable housing. MEMx recruited AEI, shaped the agenda, and built partner connections, with \$60,000 invested and plans for AEI to return in 2026.



#### **Americas Competitiveness Exchange (ACE)**



Memphis, through MEMx's year-long cultivation, applied to host ACE, an international economic development tour supported by the EDA and OAS. Hosting would spotlight Memphis as a hub for trade, investment, and global partnerships, with \$10,000 invested to date in building this relationship.
